shows up.

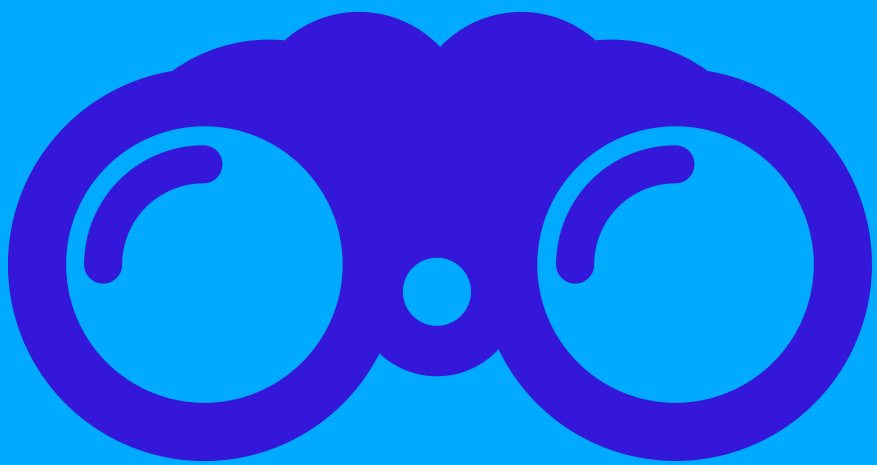


When the setup gets cleaner,
